The Hershey History Center archives are accessible for public research. This guide explains how to use the materials, search the collections, and request assistance.

Collections available for your use

Special Collections

Cemetery Records: Comprehensive documentation of gravestone markers from various church cemeteries situated in Derry Township.

Deeds: A list of 243 deeds, conveyances, mortgages, and indentures maintained at the HHC with a brief description of each.

Family Files: Over 490 files arranged by family name with stories, clippings, documents, and biographical details.

Maps: 95 historical maps, blueprints, atlases, and diagrams at HHC, each briefly described.

Newspapers: The Hershey Chronicle, Hershey Broadcaster editions are available at the society, in paper form and on microfilm.

Obituaries: A collection of 40,000 obituaries sourced from local newspapers. To view the digitized obituary clippings, please refer to the **Obituary Images** link. Additionally, <u>www.findagrave.com</u> is recommended as a valuable online resource.

Oral Histories: Over 200 accounts of Hershey and Derry Township's history recorded in audio format, with many transcriptions available.

Scrapbooks: 145 scrapbooks and photo albums are available at the HHC.

Master Collections

The three documents below list all HHC collection items. They include many of the same items mentioned earlier. The **Master Collection Groupings** summarize the objects in each document.

HHC Objects: A searchable list of over 4,000 items in HHC collections, including pins, mugs, uniforms, trophies, hockey sticks, coins, and clothing.

HHC Archives: A comprehensive catalog of over 11,000 archival items in the HHC collections is available. This catalog includes maps, documents, scrapbooks, videos, programs, booklets, and more. This report contains 3311 pages, and it may require some time to open.

HHC Library: A searchable list of over 650 items included in the HHC Library, including books, textbooks, and more.

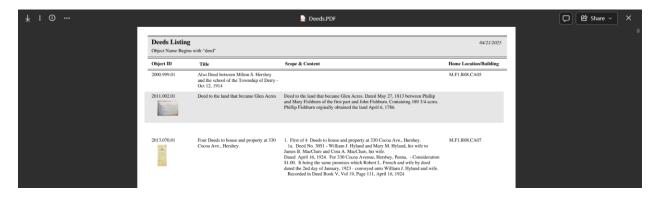

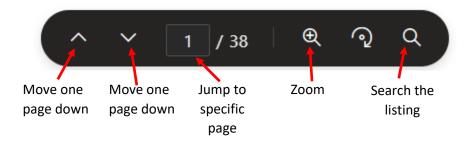
How to search for collections items.

All collection listings are available as searchable PDF files. Here are some tips to assist with your search, using the Deeds collection as an example:

After double clicking the **Deeds** the following display will appear in your browser.



A navigation bar will also appear at the bottom of the screen.

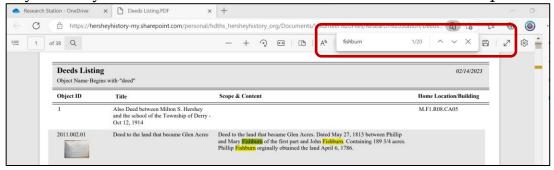


To search this listing click the Search icon on ight of the navigation bar.

The search box appears.



Enter a word or phrase to start a search. The match count will appear, and the first match will be highlighted. Navigate with < and > symbols.



How to request further assistance with your research

If you are interested in viewing the artifact displayed in the collection list, complete an online **Retrieval Request Form** (example below).

After completing the form, click **Submit** to forward the request to research@hersheyhistory.org. A volunteer will locate the requested items and place them in a secure area for viewing. Notification will be provided when the items are ready for viewing.

Upon receiving notification, please visit the museum during its regular operating hours. A volunteer will assist you in accessing the requested content. Kindly return the items to the volunteer once finished with them.

Important notes:

Our limited staff can only process specific document requests. Please complete the form accurately.

Our organization relies on dedicated volunteers, so retrieval may take a week or more. We will try to minimize your wait time.

There may be a small fee for processing, depending on the items and effort required. We will contact you for approval before proceeding.

Certain items are restricted and may not be viewable. This will be indicated on your retrieval request form.

Please ensure that all retrieved items are returned to the front desk by the close of business today.

How to complete the HHC Retrieval Request Form.

Enter your name, email address, and phone number in the space provided.

In the field "What is your availability to view the objects requested?", please provide a general time frame indicating when you will be available to visit and examine the items you have requested.

Enter the object ID for each item and give a short description to help the volunteer find and verify the artifact. Refer to the example from the Deeds Listing below.

You are permitted to request up to three items per form submission. If you wish to request additional items, please click Submit another response to access a new, blank form.
